Committee of Vice-Chancellors & Directors CVCD Excellence Awards Guidelines 2024

1.0 Introduction

CVCD Excellence Awards are made once in two years to recognize, appreciate, and honour the outstanding contributions, accomplishments and impact through research, creativity, invention, and innovation by academic staff in the Sri Lankan state University system. This scheme was introduced in 2006. This guideline documents the procedures related to the Awards for continuation of this initiative. The CVCD may introduce appropriate changes to the guidelines from time to time in order to improve the awards scheme and the stature of the ceremony.

The 2024 version incorporates changes that address timely needs in the research and development domain of the higher education sector in Sri Lanka.

2.0 Objective of the CVCD Excellence Awards

The objective of the CVCD Excellence Awards is to recognize, appreciate and honour the outstanding contributions and accomplishments in research, innovations, inventions, and creative work by the academic staff in the Sri Lankan state university system.

Three categories of awards are made by the CVCD:

- 1. Most Outstanding Senior Researcher.
- 2. Most Outstanding Young Researcher (<40 years on the closing date of applications).
- 3. Most Outstanding Inventor or Innovator.

For the first two categories, Most Outstanding Senior Researcher and Most Outstanding Young Researcher, awards are offered in the following fields.

- 1. Allied Health Sciences and Indigenous Medicine
- 2. Engineering, Architecture, and Technology
- 3. Humanities
- 4. Life Sciences
- 5. Management Studies
- 6. Medical and Dental Sciences
- 7. Natural Sciences
- 8. Social Sciences and Legal Studies

A recipient of a MOYR or MOI award may apply subsequently for a MOSR award. However, once awarded, a recipient will not be considered again in a different field of study in the same category of award. For this purpose only, the above categorization, which will be effective from 2022 onwards, may be considered comparable to the previous fields, as indicated below.

3.0 General Guidelines for Applications/Nominations

The general guidelines and instructions for applications and /or nominations and evaluation of applications for the CVCD Excellence Awards are as follows.

- 1. Applicant/Nominee can apply or be nominated for one or more awards.
- 2. Achievements and contributions during the University career up to the closing date determined by the CVCD can be included in the application. The application/ nomination should be made by using the format shown in Section 4 of these guidelines, which may be downloaded from *CVCD website>*. All claims should be supported by documentary evidence.
- 3. Applications / nominations shall be evaluated using the marking scheme set out in Note 3 of the Application Form. The applicant's self-assessment shall be for office use only. No marks shall be given by the evaluators in instances where documentary proof is not submitted.
- 4. To encourage publication of research findings in high-quality peer-reviewed journals, the CVCD issues a List of Recognized Indices of Journals and Conference Proceedings. This list, which may be updated from time to time, may be downloaded from http://cvcd.lk
- 5. The completed application form with self-assessment and supporting documents should be submitted through the online application system or sent by registered post to a designated postal address.
- 6. All applications/nominations should be forwarded through the official channels, i.e., through the Head of Department, Dean of the Faculty or Director of Institute, and the Vice-Chancellor.
- 7. Applications/nominations received after the closing date shall not be entertained.
- 8. All applications will be checked against the CVCD List of Recognized Indices of Journals and Conference Proceedings. A similarity check will be performed if necessary by University Librarians, and the report submitted for consideration by the panel of judges. However, even if a journal is listed in any of the Recognized Indices, if a query is raised by verification or evaluation panels, the applicant may be required to provide evidence to support the claim that the journal has an Editorial Board with eminent researchers, a blinded review process, regular publication of volumes and/or issues and a website with publication details. If the panel of judges determines that points have been claimed for publication(s) in predatory journals, the whole application will be disqualified.

- 9. Independent panels of judges appointed by the CVCD, comprising eminent academics that includes former Vice-Chancellors, Emeritus Professors, Senior Professors, Professors, and other eminent persons will evaluate the applications/nominations and submit their recommendations to the CVCD. All judges will be required to sign a 'Declaration of Conflict of Interest' form prior to evaluation of the applications / nominations. The points awarded by the judges during evaluation shall remain confidential to the relevant panel of judges and members of the CVCD.
- 10. The final decision regarding awards will be made by the CVCD based on the recommendations of the panels of judges. The CVCD may decide not to offer certain awards if the applicants have not reached requisite standards. In any event, the decision of the CVCD, based on the recommendations of the Evaluation Panel, shall be final.
- 11. A minimum of 100 marks is required for Most Outstanding Senior Researcher Awards, while a minimum of 60 marks is required for The Most Outstanding Young Researcher Awards. A minimum of 10 marks is required for the Most Outstanding Inventor Award.

Note 3. Evaluation of applications

3.1 Authorship and ownership

- 3.1.1 For single author publications, the author will receive 100% of the points awarded for that type of publication.
- 3.1.2 For dual author publications, if the applicant is the first or the corresponding author, he/she will receive 60% of the points for the publication. 40% of the points will be awarded if he/she is the 2^{nd} author.
- 3.1.3 For publications with more than two authors, if the applicant is the first author or the corresponding author, he/she will receive 40% of the points. The remaining 60% will be divided proportionately among the other authors.
- 3.1.4 For citations, the total marks awarded will be limited to a number equivalent to the total of all the marks awarded for all publications of Types 1 to 7.
- 3.1.5 For patents and other forms of Intellectual Property Rights, the same points will be awarded regardless of the number of owners.

3.2 Journal Rankings (applicable to Type 1 publications only)

- 3.2.1 Publications in journals ranked in Q1 in SCImago Journal Rankings (SJR) for the year of publication shall be awarded up to 6 points, subject to above conditions regarding authorship.
- 3.2.2 Publications in journals ranked in Q2 or Q3 in SJR for the year of publication should be awarded up to 5 marks, subject to above conditions regarding authorship.
- 3.2.3 Publications in journals ranked in Q4 in SJR for the year of publication, or publications listed in other recognized indices, with no quartile ranking in SJR, should be awarded up to 4 marks, subject to above conditions regarding authorship.
- 3.2.4 If SJR shows more than one quartile ranking for a journal because it covers multiple subject areas, the applicant should indicate the quartile ranking relevant to the subject area of his/her specific publication
